

School of Philosophy Assistant Professor, Tenure-Track – Priest-Scholar

The School of Philosophy at The Catholic University of America seeks to fill a position at the rank of Assistant Professor, tenure-track. In view of its standing as an ecclesiastical faculty of philosophy, and of the significant number of seminarians in its undergraduate program, the School seeks a Roman Catholic priest for this position.

Although the AOS is also open, we are particularly interested in applicants working in the following areas:

- Ancient philosophy, especially ethics
- Neoplatonism
- Medieval philosophy, especially ethics
- Political philosophy.

Whatever his research focus, successful applicants will have a thorough grounding in the history of philosophy and will complement the strengths of the current faculty. We also seek candidates who understand, are enthusiastic about, and will make a significant contribution to <u>the mission of the University</u>, which reads as follows:

As the national university of the Catholic Church in the United States, founded and sponsored by the bishops of the country with the approval of the Holy See, The Catholic University of America is committed to being a comprehensive Catholic and American institution of higher learning, faithful to the teachings of Jesus Christ as handed on by the Church. Dedicated to advancing the dialogue between faith and reason, The Catholic University of America seeks to discover and impart the truth through excellence in teaching and research, all in service to the Church, the nation and the world.

Duties include graduate and undergraduate teaching, active research, dissertation and thesis supervision, student advising, and the usual committee work. Candidates should have Ph.D. at the time of appointment and possess competence in appropriate ancient and modern languages.

All applications should include:

- i. a cover letter;
- ii. a CV;
- a one- to two-page personal statement indicating how the applicant, through his research, teaching, and service, would make a distinctive contribution to the <u>University's mission</u> and to the vision of Catholic education outlined in the Apostolic Constitution on Catholic Universities' <u>Ex Corde Ecclesiae</u> and <u>Veritatis Gaudium</u>;

- iv. a research dossier containing an outline of current and future research interests;
- v. a writing sample in the candidate's area of specialization;
- vi. three confidential letters of recommendation;
- vii. transcripts of all graduate work.

Review of applications will begin on December 1st and will continue until all positions are filled.
