

Associate Professor of Architecture School of Architecture and Planning

The School of Architecture and Planning at The Catholic University of America invites applications to fill a tenure-track position at the level of Associate Professor or Ordinary Professor depending on the applicant's qualifications, to lead the Sacred Space and Cultural Studies design concentration and the Walton Program, to begin in August, 2024.

The program at the School of Architecture and Planning offers students courses of study leading to a Bachelor of Arts in Architecture degree, Bachelor of Science in Architecture degree, Master of Science in Net Zero Design degree, and an accredited professional Master of Architecture degree.

The concentration and the Walton Program examine the spiritual and cultural roots of place-making. They are supported by the <u>mission of the University</u>, which reads as follows: "as the national university of the Catholic Church in the United States, founded and sponsored by the bishops of the country with the approval of the Holy See, The Catholic University of America is committed to being a comprehensive Catholic and American institution of higher learning, faithful to the teachings of Jesus Christ as handed on by the Church. Dedicated to advancing the dialogue between faith and reason, The Catholic University of America seeks to discover and impart the truth through excellence in teaching and research, all in service to the Church, the nation and the world."

The School welcomes fair, critical, and open debate about how various building traditions, especially the sacred ones, can serve the common good in diverse places and cultures. The ideal candidate will take a long view of architecture and the human conditions that affect it. That individual should seek to teach the art of building through the lens of sacred culture to help students understand, preserve, and reimagine the traditions of vernacular, classical, and contemporary architecture in the service of building communities.



Qualifications

1. PhD and/or Licensure in architecture;

2. Master of Architecture (Professional) Degree from a school of architecture with NAABaccreditation or another nation's equivalent accrediting body where the candidate was educated;

3. Record of teaching, research, professional practice, and publication on the subjects of sacred culture and spirituality in architecture;

4. Clear understanding of, appreciation for, and advocacy of architectural design with tradition and innovative approaches to present day opportunities to make a better world.

5. Exceptional communication skills and teaching ability along with the willingness to collaborate with the School of Architecture and Planning's Faculty as well as Catholic University's faculty in other disciplines [e.g. Fine Arts, Engineering, Sociology, Political Science, Philosophy and Theology];

Duties and Responsibilities

<u>Course Instruction</u>: Appointed candidate will teach design studio courses, lecture courses, and seminars, and advise thesis students in their area(s) of expertise as assigned by the Dean's Office.

<u>School and University Service</u>: In addition to formal academic student advising, the position requires service responsibilities including but not limited to service on school and university committees.

<u>Research and Research Equivalents</u>: Continuing progress throughout the candidate's appointment on peer-reviewed publication of scholarship and research, and/or practice is a position requirement.



Application Requirements

1. Cover letter, including a summary of professional accomplishments and research interests;

2. A complete *curriculum vitae*;

3. Portfolio of work samples and publications designed, formatted and presented as a single print volume or digital file (not larger than 100MB);

4. Name and contact information for three or more academic and/or professional references; letters of recommendation will be required for the finalists;

5. One-to-two page personal statement of teaching philosophy and how the applicant's research, teaching, and service will contribute to, foster, and enrich The Catholic <u>University's mission</u> and how the candidate's efforts will embody the vision of Catholic education set forth in the Apostolic Constitution on Catholic Universities - <u>Ex Corde</u> <u>Ecclesiae</u>.

Applications are due no later than October 15, 2023, 5:00 PM

Reviews will be completed, and finalists will be informed of on-campus interviews by December 15, 2023

Interviews will be conducted between January 25, 2024, and March 5, 2024

An offer to the selected candidate will be made by March 15, 2024
