The Department of Chemistry at the Catholic University of America in Washington, DC, seeks to fill a tenure-track position to begin August 2024. The candidate will be expected to establish independent research programs with substantive undergraduate participation and contribute to departmental teaching in foundational and upper-level chemistry courses. We are interested in exceptional candidates in all areas of chemistry but hope to strengthen our program in the areas of inorganic, environmental, and analytical chemistry.
