Assistant Professor of Finance**

The Busch School of Business at The Catholic University of America seeks candidates to fill a full-time position as Assistant Professor of Finance to begin August 2020.

The Catholic University of America is the national university of the Catholic Church with 6,000 undergraduate and graduate students in more than 180 academic programs on a residential campus in the heart of the nation's capital. The Tim and Steph Busch School of Business, founded in 2013, is committed to the application of Catholic Social Doctrine to business through thought leadership and formation of students as virtuous Catholic business leaders. The Busch School is housed in Maloney Hall, a beautiful century-old collegiate gothic building reopened in early 2019 after a \$37 million renovation.

We seek candidates who understand, are enthusiastic about, and will make a significant contribution to our [University's mission](#), which reads as follows: "As the national university of the Catholic Church in the United States, founded and sponsored by the bishops of the country with the approval of the Holy See, The Catholic University of America is committed to being a comprehensive Catholic and American institution of higher learning, faithful to the teachings of Jesus Christ as handed on by the Church. The position is a tenure-track appointment at the rank of assistant professor, although candidates at other ranks will also be considered. Responsibilities include research, teaching, and mentoring students, both undergraduate and graduate. The successful candidate will have a strong commitment to excellence in teaching and will be expected to build a research program that will enhance the school's reputation for innovation, engagement and impact.

Applicants must have a doctoral degree in finance or a related field, although ABD's will be considered. For fullest consideration, applications should be received by December 31, 2019. Applications should include: a letter of interest, *curriculum vitae*, sample publications, the names and contact information of three references, and a one- to two-page personal statement indicating how the applicant's research, teaching, and service will make a distinctive contribution to our [University's mission](#) and to the vision of Catholic education outlined in the Apostolic Constitution on Catholic Universities [Ex Corde Ecclesiae](#).
