

Faculty Position in Education (Special Education)

The Department of Education in the School of Arts and Sciences at The Catholic University of America, located in Washington, DC, seeks to fill the position of Tenure-Track Assistant Professor of Special Education to begin in August 2020.

Preference will be given to candidates who have expertise in classical liberal arts education and experience in pre-K-12 teaching and higher education, preferably in a teacher education program and/or in a special education program. The candidate must hold an earned doctorate in special education and be able to provide evidence of research promise. Salary is commensurate with qualifications. Responsibilities include:

- Teach graduate and undergraduate courses in teacher education including courses in special education, early childhood special education, and/or assessment
- Supervise special education candidates in their field experiences
- Advise special education candidates
- Conduct and direct research in one's area of specialization
- Coordinate special education program
- Complete accreditation reports and revise assessment instruments
- Serve on departmental committees
- Assist with recruitment

Application requirements:

Applicants should send 1) a letter of interest, 2) a curriculum vitae, 3) names of three references, and 4) a one- to two-page personal statement that should indicate how your research, teaching, and service will make a distinctive contribution to our <u>University's</u>

<u>mission</u> and to the vision of Catholic education outlined in the Apostolic Constitution on Catholic Universities *Ex Corde Ecclesiae*.
