This is a full-time, tenured position at the rank of Associate or Ordinary (Full) Professor. The start date would be June of 2023.

- Teach in at least one of the areas within the department

- Promote faculty excellence in research and teaching
- Oversee department instruction and administration
- Represent the department within the university to advance its reputation, visibility, and collaborative ventures

- Foster a collegial and consultative atmosphere that supports the department's and the University's mission

Minimum Qualifications:

- PhD in an area relevant to Modern Languages and Literatures
- Native or near native proficiency in English and in another language
- Demonstration of teaching excellence and distinguished scholarly production appropriate for the rank of Associate or Full Professor
- Previous administrative experience in higher education
- Proven ability to work collaboratively and successfully with a diverse group of faculty, students, and administrators

About the Department:

The Department of Modern Languages and Literatures is an integral part of the School of Arts and Sciences. Our faculty are committed to providing students with educational opportunities of the highest quality aimed at forming life-long, culturally competent, global citizens. Our courses in language, culture, literature, and practical skills prepare majors and minors in French and Francophone Studies, German Studies, Italian Studies, Hispanic Studies and Spanish for International Service. In addition, our faculty contribute to the general education language and Explorations of Literature requirements and to interdisciplinary certificates and minors in Asian Studies (Chinese), Islamic World Studies (Arabic), Irish Studies (Irish), Latin American and Latino Studies, European Studies, and Spanish for Healthcare. - The names and contact information for three references.
